


Mary: I don't understand anything. Can you please explain?


Dr. Colour: For you to understand what I am saying, I have to start from the beginning.








When God created Adam and Eve,






"You have redeemed me, O Lord God of truth."

John: Who crucified Him? And why was He crucified? **Dr. Colour:** The bad people crucified Him. They didn't like Him for many reasons, but mostly because of His love for all people. When they found the opportunity, they arrested Him and asked Pilate, the governor, to crucify Him.

Mary: But He did not do anything wrong.

Dr. Colour: That's right. He did not do anything

wrong. That's what Pilate said too.

He said that Our Lord Jesus was innocent, but he

wanted to make the people happy. Pilate ordered that Jesus be crucified. They put a crown of thorns on His head and crucified Him between two thieves.

Mary: What happened next?

The Lord appeared to them for forty days. By His crucifixion and resurrection, we returned to our original image. He opened the door of heaven for us and gave us a new life.


Jesus Is Alive!



When Dr. Colour finished the story about the redemption...:

Dr. Colour: Because our Lord Jesus loves us, He died for us and that's why we have to love one another. Love is not only through words but it's how we act towards each other. **Brushy:** Wow! That's exactly the love you showed for me. If it wasn't for you, I would have never returned to my original image. From now on, I will do like you. I will love and help everyone.



Mary: Loving people, helping them and being kind to them, can change many things. John, do you

remember the play that we did last year in Mahragan Al Keraza and won 3rd place?

John: Of course, its was called "Be kind". I will never forget it.

Dr. Colour: That sounds like a good play.

Brushy: Can we watch this play?

Mary: Brushy, you can't watch it now, but John and I can tell you the story.

St. Pachomius, the Father of the Communal life (Cenobitic life)

Mary: Before he became a monk, St. Pachomius was a soldier in the army. One day, he went out with a group of soldiers to fight the people who rebelled against the king. After a long trip, they reached a city named Esna where they stopped to rest. There in Esna, something really amazing happened.

Brushy: What happened?






Mary: The people in the city of Esna offered them food to eat and water to drink. This act of kindness made the soldiers amazed. St. Pachomius asked them:

"Why are you doing this for us?" One of them answered him and said: "We did this because our Lord Jesus taught us to love, help and show kindness to others."

Bambino: Wow! The people of Esna had great love towards others.





John: You know Bambino, because of the kindness of those people, St Pachomius decided to become a Christian. He decided that if he comes back from war, he would learn about Christianity. He wanted to be like the people of Esna, who loved God so much.

Mary: What happened next was quite surprising. The revolution against the king ended without war, and St. Pachomius returned home safely.



John: He was baptized and became a Christian just like he had decided to do. He stayed in Esna for 2 years, serving everyone with love.

Mary: St. Pachomius heard about a saint monk named Abba Palamoun. He went to him to become a monk. St. Pachomius loved God more and more every day. He always prayed, fasted and read the Holy Bible. He loved all the monks.







One day, while he was collecting some logs, an angel appeared to him. The angel had a tablet with a set of rules written on it. These were the new rules for how monks should live together in the monastery. These rules are the reason the church called him the father of communal life. **Brushy:** What does "Father of communal life" mean?

Mary: Before St. Pachomius, each monk used to stay in his own cell by himself to pray. But when

the angel gave the new rules to him, the monks would gather to pray, eat, work and live together. This is the communal rule that St. Pachomius established in the monastery. Did you see how the kindness of the people of Esna led St. Pachomius to Christianity? This is the story of our play.

a hurry.


Bambino: I forgot to introduce you guys. Rado, this is Mary,

God was always with them. He protected them from their enemies. All what God wanted from them was to follow His commandments and obey His law.






But the people were stubborn. They always disobeyed God's law and were driven far away from Him.

God was not happy with them because they were far from Him. He was also not happy with all their sins. Because of that, their enemies attacked them and made them slaves.






The Israelites were very sad because of their slavery and they cried out to God to deliver them from their enemies, the Midianites.

John: What did Gideon do to conquer them?










Mary: The Midianites were a lot more than the Israelites. At first, God asked Gideon to tell the people who were afraid to go back and many of them left.

Rado: How can they fight when so many people left? They will lose!

Mary: No, they didn't lose. You will be surprised to know that their army became even smaller.

Bambino: Their number dropped again, why? Mary: Well, these men went to get a drink of water.

Some got down on their knees and this was a sign that they did not care about the battle. Others showed that they really cared because they took water in their hands and drank while they were standing.





Those were the ones chosen. There were only 300 of them, but Gideon trusted in God's words and he knew that they would win.

Wise Crayon: What did Gideon do next, Mary?

Mary: Gideon divided the 300 soldiers into three groups. Each man had a trumpet in his right hand and a pitcher with a lit torch in his left hand. These were their weapons.



John: How did they fight with these funny weapons?

Mary: At night, while their enemy's army was sleeping, God's people surrounded them. When Gideon gave them a signal, each man blew the trumpet, broke the pitcher to let the torch shine, and shouted "The sword of the Lord and Gideon". The Midianites thought that a huge army surrounded them. They ran away, crying out as they fled. Gideon, with God's help, won the battle with only 300 men and very unusual weapons. Wise Crayon: Very good, they knew how to think right.

John: We too, we have to do like them and think in the right way.

Mary: Surely, God will be with us and will never leave us if we trust in Him and think in the right way.

When John, Mary and all their friends heard the story of Gideon, they had hope and started to think about a solution for their problem.


John: I have an idea! What if we build a high wall to stop the water from coming into the city?

Rado: What do you think? No more Rado or no more Crayon City? The city is more important. We don't have


much time to talk. I have to save the city. Good bye friends, I will miss you.

Everyone watched as Rado ran away. They were very amazed at what he did.










Mary: Don't be upset Bambino. I am sure that God will not leave him.

Bambino: I have no hope. There will be no more Rado. I am so sad.


John: Bambino, what you said reminded me of God's people a long time ago. They were just like you. They did not have hope and did not trust God.

Twelve men were sent, one from each tribe. They were to find out about the land and make sure it was a good land (*Deuteronomy 1:22-25*).



Mary: That's right. The twelve men went to the land of Canaan. They returned after 40 days. They brought a cluster of grapes. The cluster was so big that it took two men to carry it on a pole between them.

They also brought some of the pomegranates and figs as Moses told them. They stood in front of Moses and all the people to tell them what they saw.







John: Ten of them said that the land was really good. But they were afraid because the people there were strong men of war (the descendants of Anak). The cities were fortified. So, like you Bambino, they did not have any hope to win and take the Promised Land and this scared the Israelites.

Mary: The other two, Caleb the son of Jep-





Bambino: What is it?



Mary: That's right Brushy. They were very happy. But unfortunately they did not do the most important thing. You know what?






John: They did not thank God for what He did for them.

Mary: Of course, whoever thanks God will enjoy God's love and rejoice even more. That's why the church teaches us to start all our prayers with the Prayer of Thanksgiving. It reminds us to thank God for all what He has done for us just like the Holy Bible teaches us saying:



He will not let your foot slip he who watches over you will not slumber; indeed, he who watches over Israel will neither slumber nor sleep.

The LORD watches over you the LORD is your shade at your right hand; the sun will not harm you by day, nor the moon by night.

The LORD will keep you from all harm he will watch over your life; the LORD will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore. Alleluia.

This Psalm shows us how much God cares about us.
