5. My Hand Offers To Him

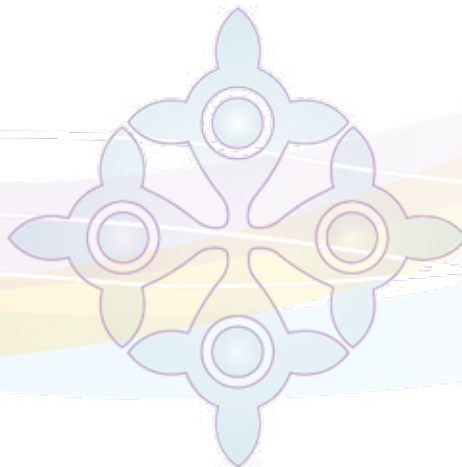

Cathy and Roby do what Ozo tells them. On their way, Ozo starts to tell them about his planet.

Ozo: The Orbanas of the Lamb? What does that mean?

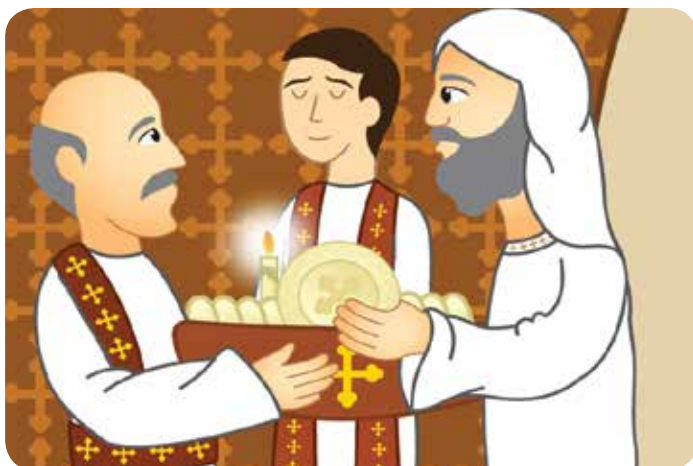

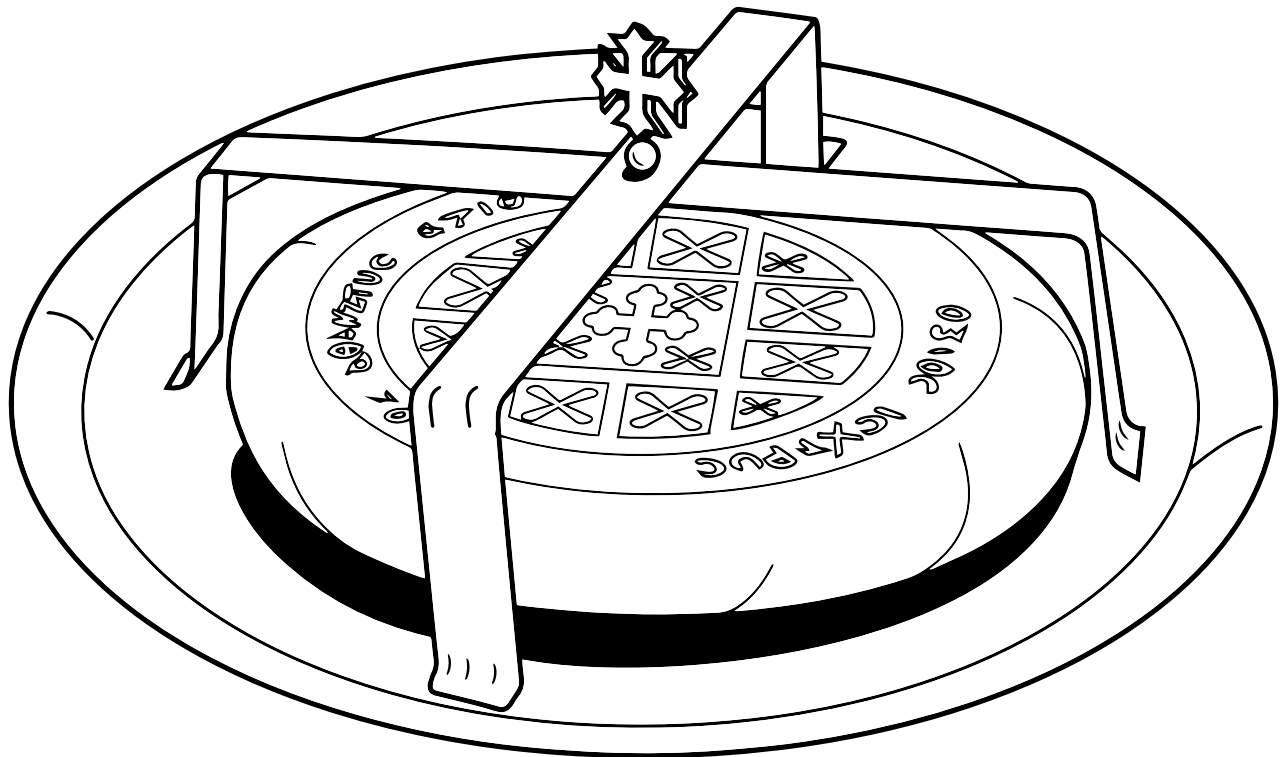

Roby: In Babylon, there was an idol called Baal. The people of Babylon worshipped this idol thinking that he was a god. They also offered him food and drink.

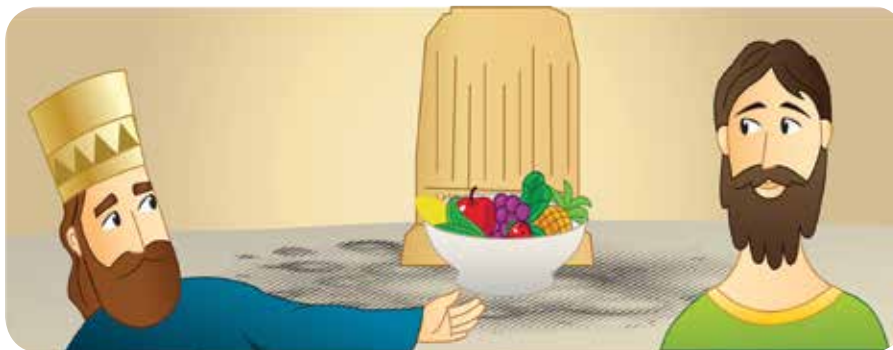
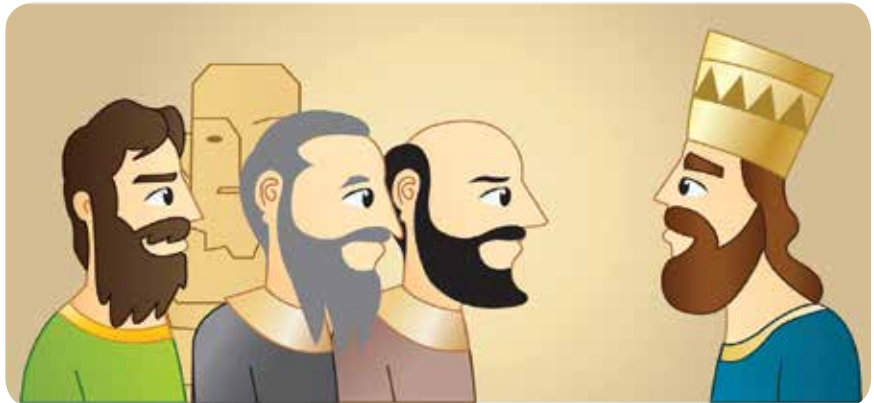
Cathy: Everyday the king would go and worship his god Baa,l but Daniel worshiped the true God whom he

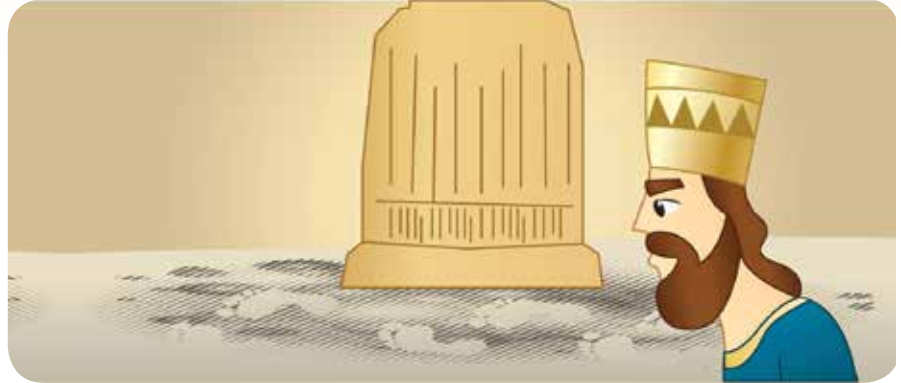

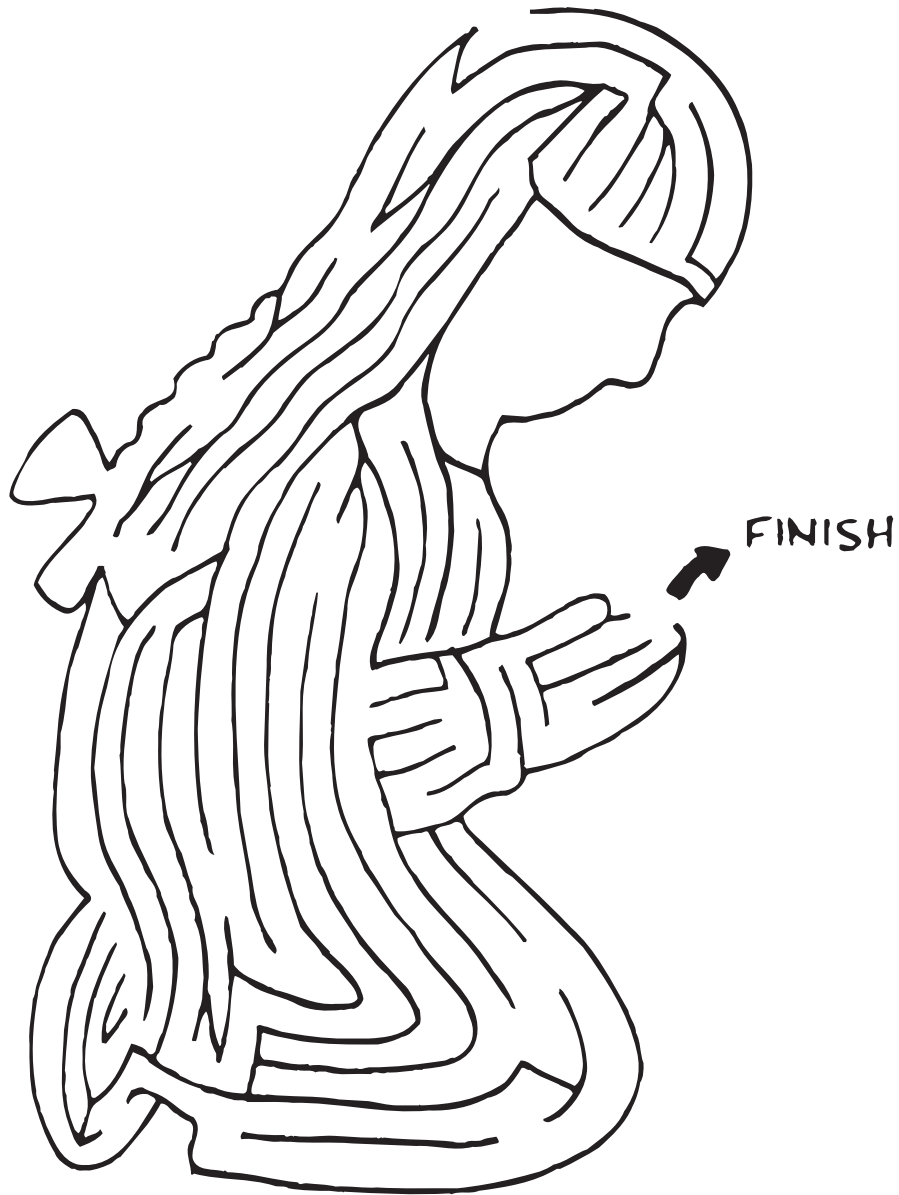
Everyone laughs, relieved that the problem was solved. Ozo then comes back after filling up his rocket with chocolate.

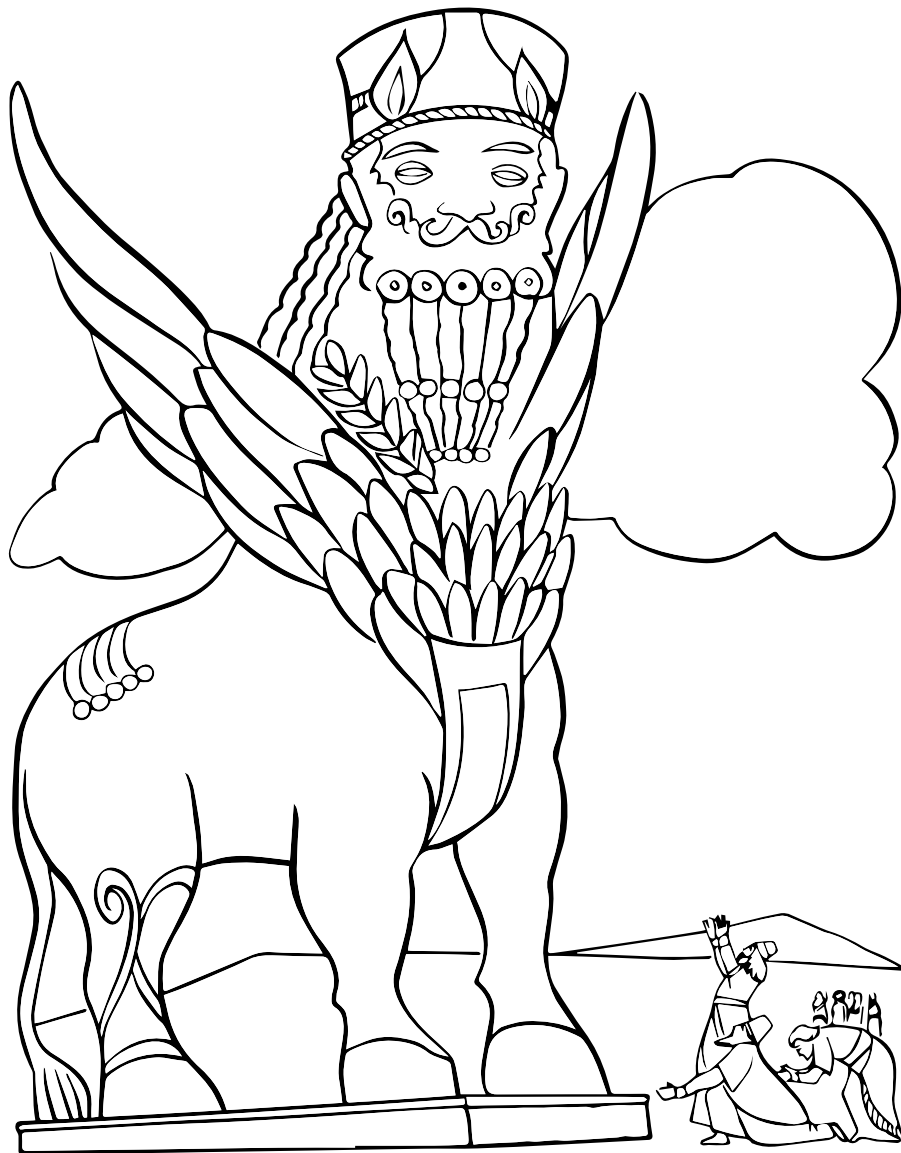
